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



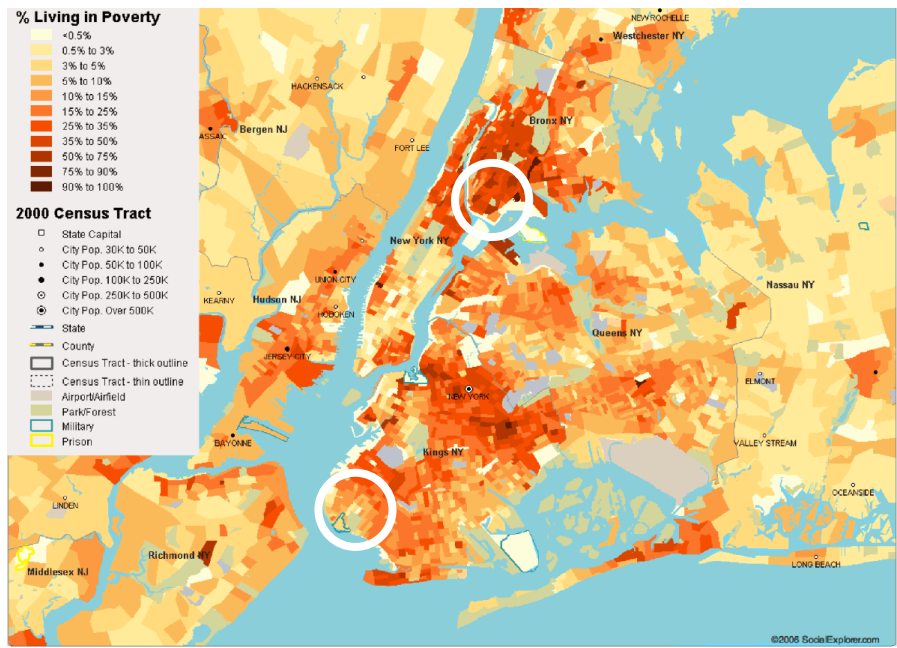
Targeting helping parents of any kind or stage, I wanted to bring pediatric care, counseling services, and most importantly paid leave legal help. Mobilizing legal help can help more parents receive the help they need to properly receive their paid leave. Using two income contrasting neighborhoods in NYC, I placed different configurations into those areas.





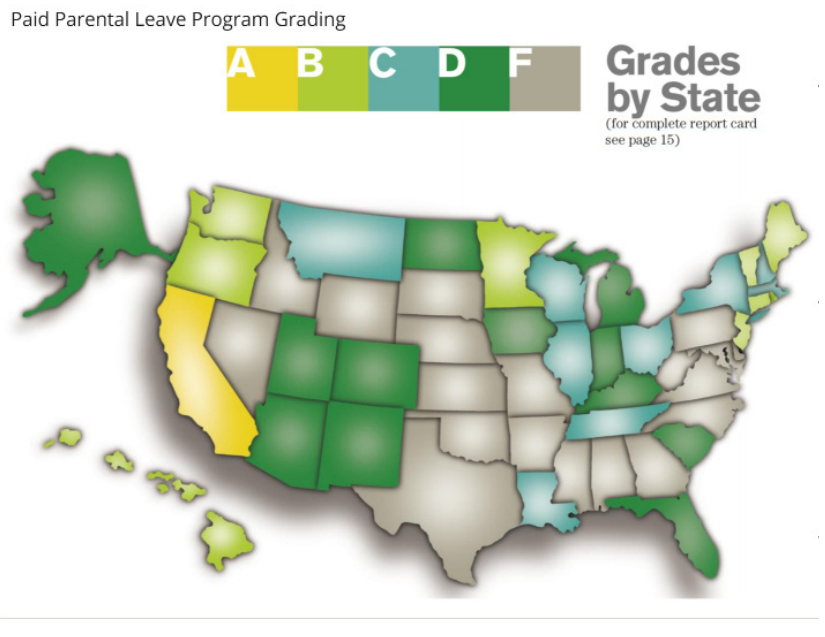
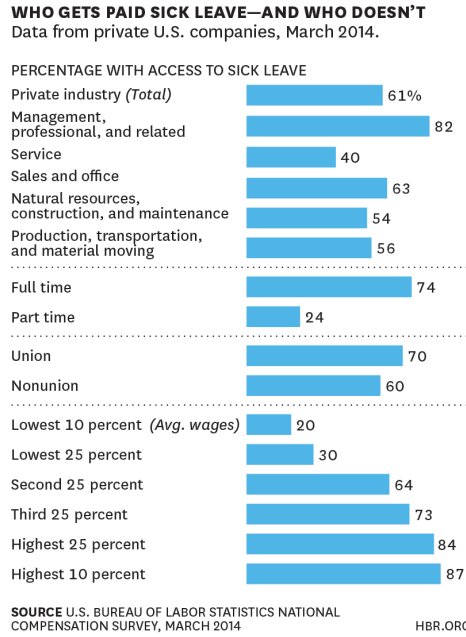
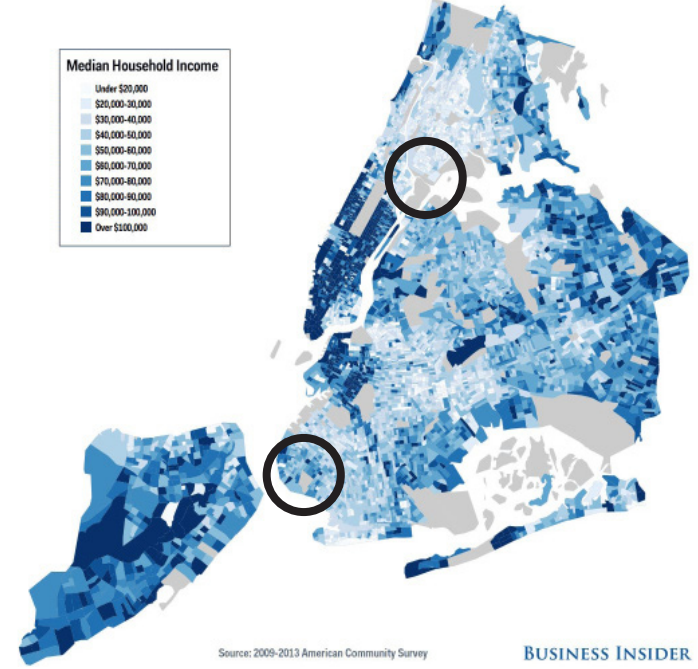






Using the paid parental leave grading based on state chart below, I gathered that using a C rating state, specifically New York State, would be most effective because there may be a chance that my mobile clinic can help both the people that receive paid parental leave and the ones that don't. There was also a chance that people would be more interested in the services provided by my mobile clinic since it is a C rated state. From there, I looked at the blue chart and gathered that workers from the service industry and those in the lowest 10% average wage receive less paid parental help.

With that information, I searched for the lowest income areas in New York City. So, I decided to choose Hunts Point, Bronx, which was one of the low income neighborhoods in NYC, as one of the locations for the Parents United mobile clinic to stop at. Then, I decided to choose a neighborhood that is a mid-tier income neighborhood to create a configuration for a neighborhood that most likely doesn't need legal help as much as the parental workshops and group meetings. So, Bay Ridge, Brooklyn became the second location where the Parents United mobile clinic would be parked at.

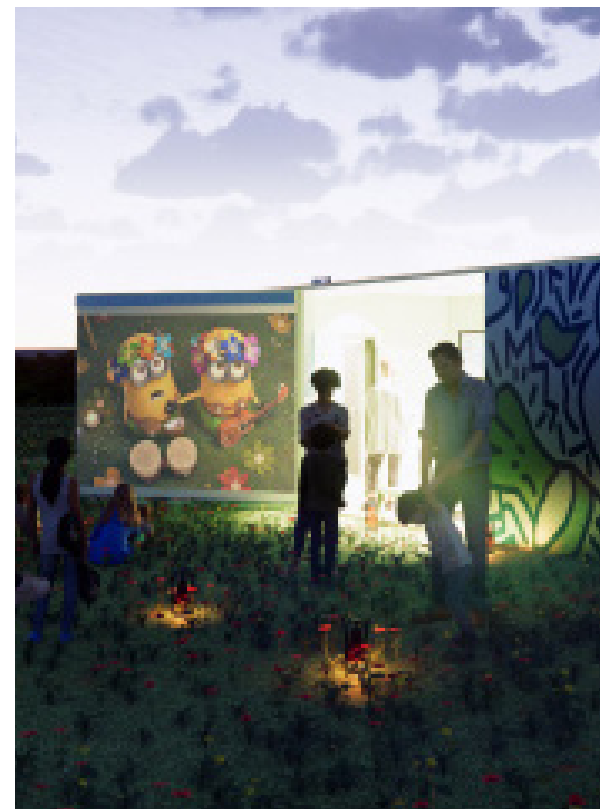

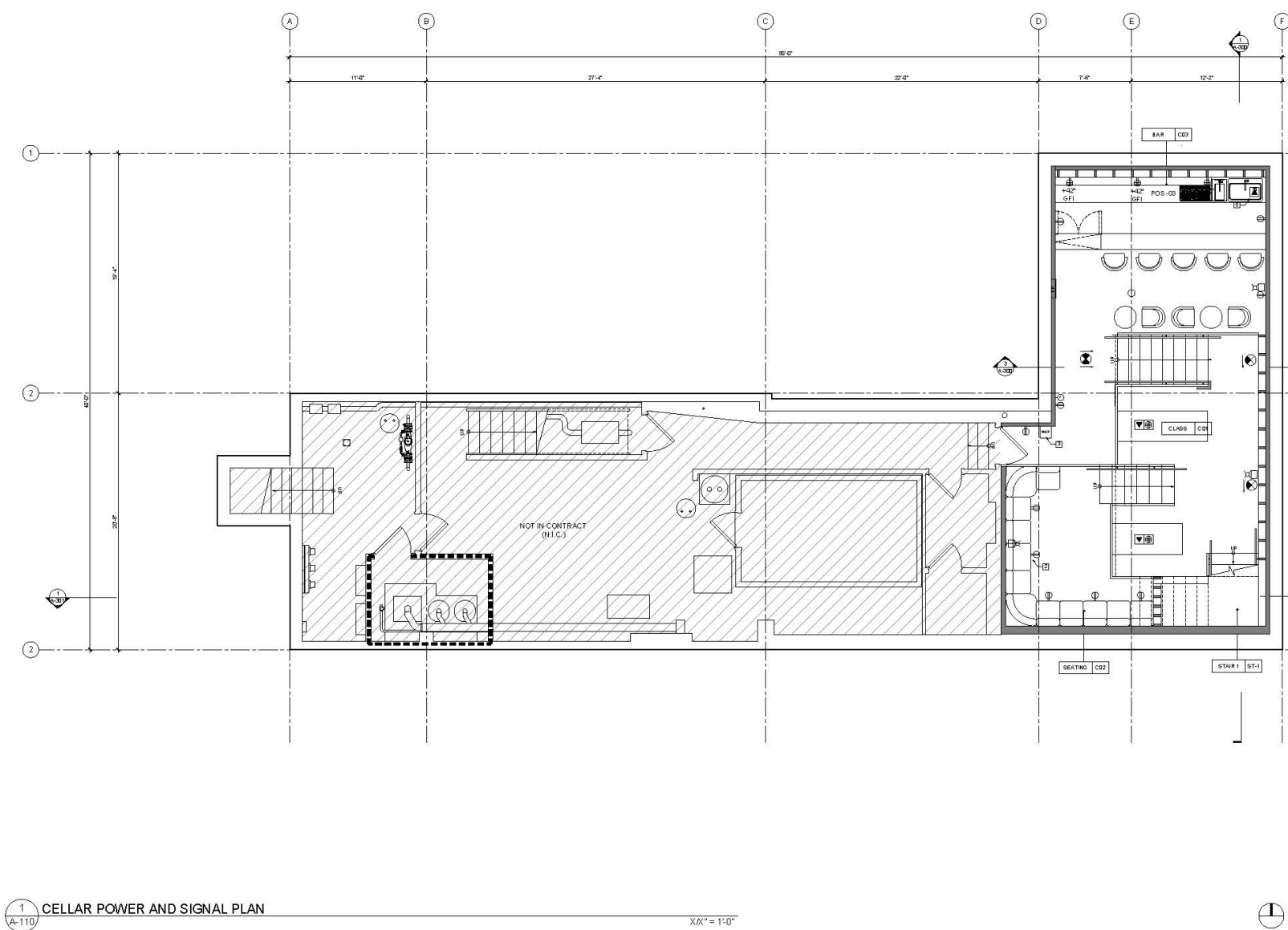


# FARM TO TABLE. SPECIALITY CAFE AND BAR.

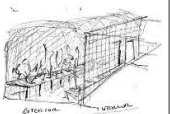

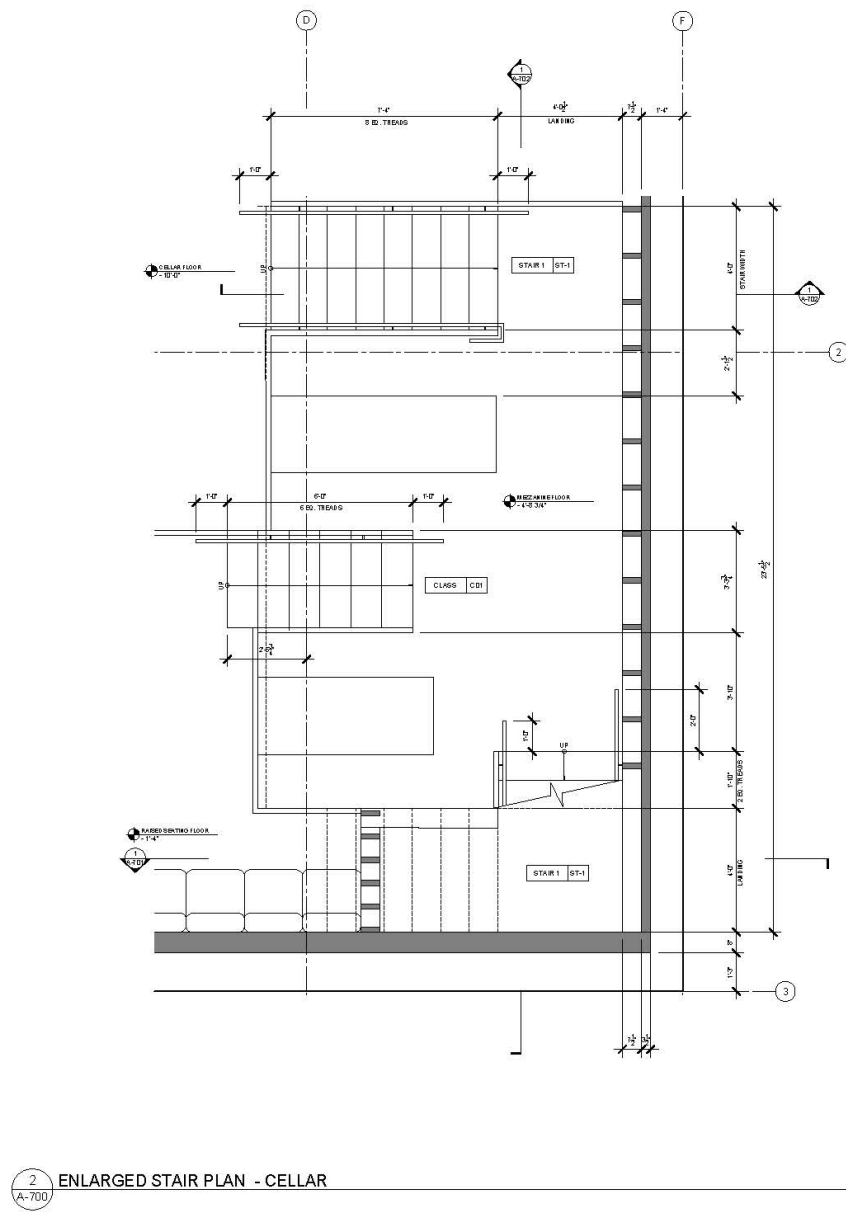

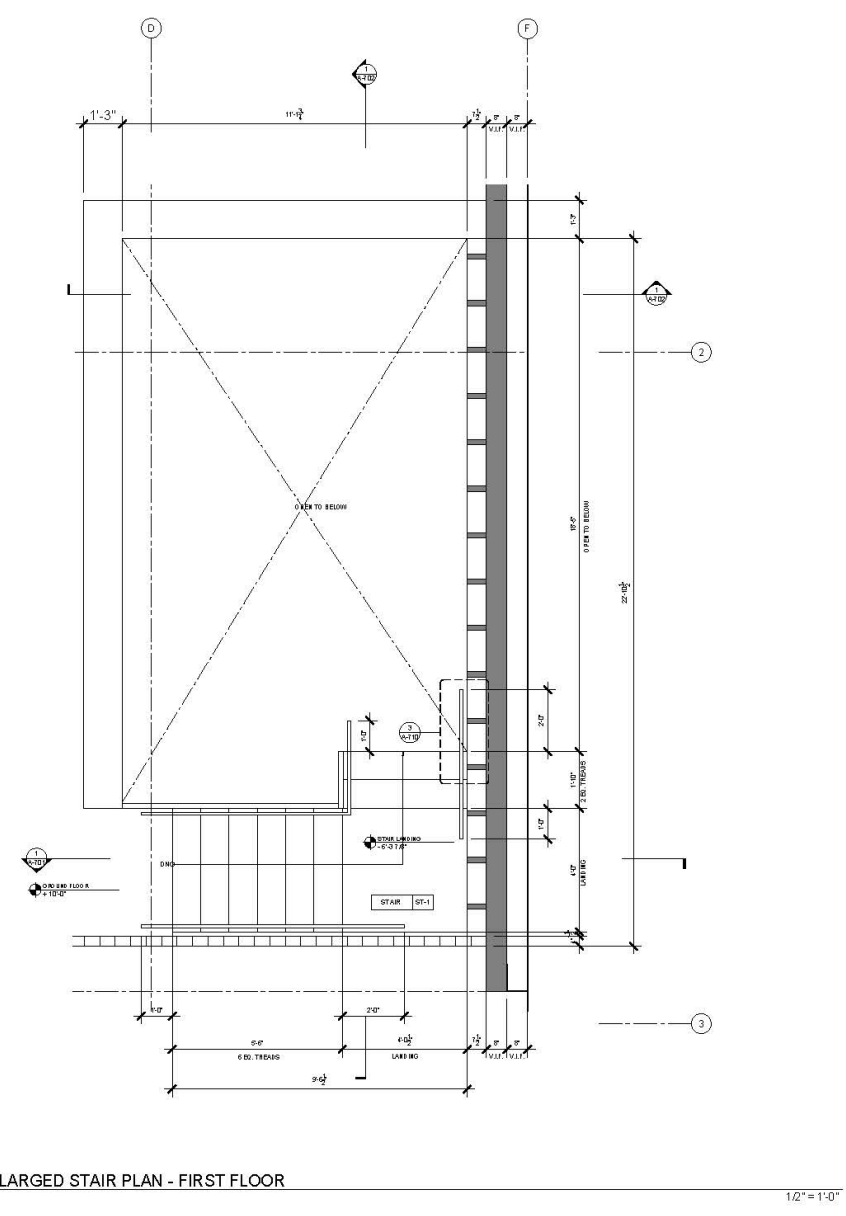

**2 ENLARGED STAIR PLAN - CELLAR**

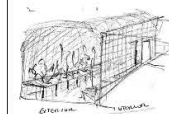


**1 ENLARGED STAIR PLAN - FIRST FLOOR**

### ROMA NORTE

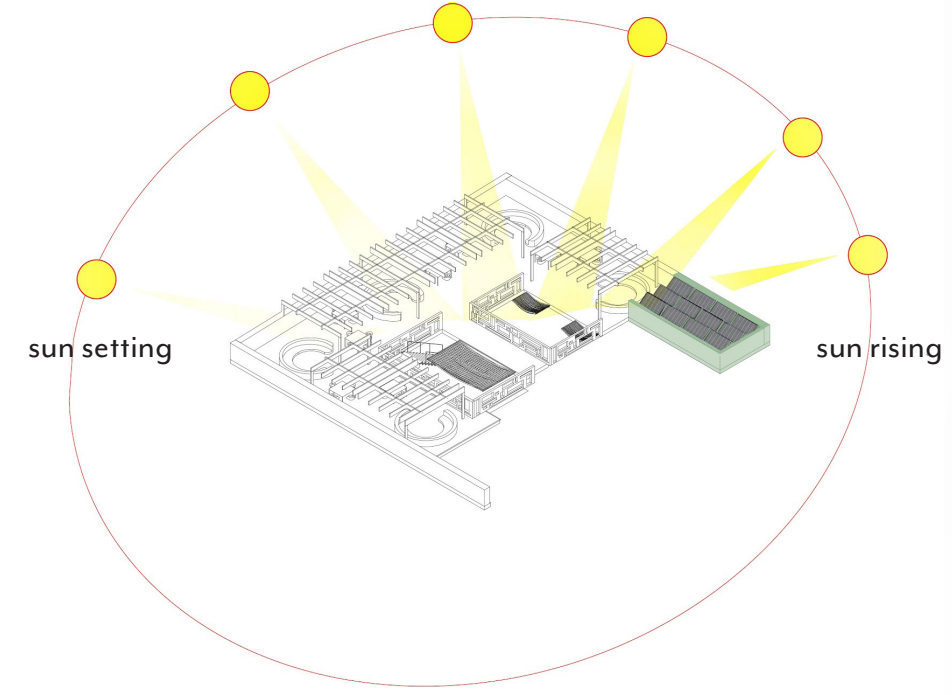
