
















EXISTING REPRODUCTIVE ORGANIZATIONS RESEARCH




PARENTS UNITED CLINIC SERVICES AND PURPOSE



Using the paid parental leave grading based on state chart below, I gathered that using a C rating state, specifically New York State, would be most effective because there may be a chance that my mobile clinic can help both the people that recieve paid parental leave and the ones that don't. There was also a chance that people would be more interested in the services provided by my mobile clinic since it is a C rated state. From there, I looked at the blue chart and gathered that workers from the service industry and those in the lowest 10% average wage recieve less paid parental help.

With that information, I searched for the lowest income areas in New York City. So, I decided to choose Hunts Point, Bronx, which was one of the low income neighborhoods in NYC, as one of the locations for the Parents United mobile clinic to stop at. Then, I decided to choose a neighborhood that is a mid-tier income neighborhood to create a configuration for a neighborhood that most likely doesn't need legal help as much as the parental workshops and group meetings. So, Bay Ridge, Brooklyn became the second location where the Parents United mobile clinic would be parked at.

WORKSHOP/ GROUP MEETINGS

Services are given to parents (new, single, or experienced) that want to learn more about taking care of children, paid leave, share experiences with one another, and more.

8-10 people max per workshop or meeting



PAID LEAVE PROGRAM OR LEGAL HEL

Free service open to anyone that needs help or want to learn more about paid leave programs. If anyone doesn't know where to start to get paid leave, they can get help here. Or if anyone needs a legal representative, that service is also provided here.

1 person per legal representative



PEDIATRICIAN

Free service is provided for those that can't afford or get access to health insurance. An appointment is needed to meet with the medical professional. Check in is at the entrance. Body examinations, vaccinations, and health problems are able to be done here with our pediatrician.

1 pediatrician per mobile clinic



OUTDOOR MOVIE THEATRE

Free movies are played at our on site projection screen. Service availabilities depends on weather but is closed for the whole winter season. The movies played are rated PG-13 and below. This service is free to the public but also to whoever is waiting for an appointment or meeting at the Parents United mobile clinic.



ROMA NORTE

- One of the neighborhoods with the highest average annual income and was originally a neighborhood for Mexico City's upper class until the 1985 earthquake brought the neighborhood through hard times.

- The neighborhood features art deco mansions and colorful street art. Roma District is located in the heart of Mexico City which makes it easy for tourists and travellers to visit Mexico City's famous sights and landmarks.


