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
office space

This project is a redesign of the office space at 500 Park Avenue, for the United Nations Division for Inclusive Social Development. The main goal of this division is to promote social inclusion and equality. I wanted my design to reflect this mission. I created colorful curved glass partition walls, so that the office members could see one another and feel a sense of community while working. I also wanted these partitions to be pod-like, to consider social distancing in the work place.

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The planning strategies are from "Spatial Strategies for Interior Design," by Ian Higgins, (images on left). It talks about spatial relationships and circulation strategies. For the circulation strategy, I took the "passing through" approach, where pathways are taken by a means of breaking through two spaces. By creating opportunities to pass through spaces, socializing and collaboration are encouraged, or are more likely to happen.

For the spatial relationship, I took two approaches: "overlapping spaces," and "linked by a common space." In the instance of an overlapping space, employees have the opportunity to flow in and out of their offices. For the "linking of common space," there is a central meeting area that individual offices share, creating a separation of semi-private work space and common space.

I wanted to create a space where there were different types of private or public exposure. Most of the offices are semi-public, to encourage a collaborative work environment.

The semi-public offices are for project support and project directors. The operations director, IT directors, and the executive director have fully private offices. There are also fully private meeting rooms, phone booths, and the auditorium is private. The conference rooms and meeting rooms along the right wall are semi-private. The classrooms on the top left also have this condition. The lobby, reception, waiting area, dining area, meeting tables, and open work area are public spaces.

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



bubble space




bar elevation and enlarged plan

It was on display at the Pratt Manhattan Gallery in February 2020.





The Difference - Between What I Want and What I Can Have






