
//Thesis statement



'Is there anything we can do as designers to leave these historical and cultural memories behind?'


'How to integrate modern materials with these old buildings, so that the building can adapt to The Times, but also leave the memory of the building?'

'What does it mean that a hotel enters a traditional way of life? Is it intrusive? Supportive? Mutually beneficial? Does it commodify a traditional way of life or preserve it?'



In my design, the structure and materials of the building themselves *symbolize the history and culture of a city* but because it was built so early, the living conditions are quite backward.

//Design Concept: nature + history + experience = life






